The whole number of patients under treatment, during the year, was one hundred and seventy-nine; being considerably less than last year, when the whole number was one hundred and ninety-six. The average number of patients for the year, is One hundred and thirty-eight twentyfive-twenty-sixths, or in whole numbers, one hundred and thirtynine. On the 31st December, 1856, there were in the Hospital one hundred and forty-two patients; of whom sixty-nine were males, and seventy-three females. During the year 1857, there were admitted thirty-seven; of whom twenty-one were males, and sixteen females. There were discharged thirty-nine; of whom twenty-three were males, and sixteen females.
